Patriots –In 2009, the Marine Corps suffered 52 suicides in 2010 there were 37 and last year there were 33. That's over 100 suicides about half of a rifle company. For a period of time, here at Lejeune, every Battalion returning had a suicide. If you feel that you are having trouble coping, call the National Suicide Prevention Lifeline at 1-800-273-TALK (8255), a free, 24-hour hotline available to anyone in suicidal crisis or emotional distress. Your call will be routed to the nearest crisis center to you. You can also go online to: www.suicidepreventionlifeline.org. Of course you can always call one of our officers for help. Don't be another non-combat statistic, life is too precious and you mean way too much to our chapter and your family.

Heart Riders group. Patriot Vanek, whatever chapter that joins you in Texas is definitely getting an asset. Also on 11 May the Field Medical Training Battalion will conduct another graduation, sending young docs and chaplain's body guards out to the field. This takes place at 0900, again we will present plaques to the honor grads of both job specialties. On 17 May, two Handicapped veteran cyclists will arrive in the local area after biking from CA. They are scheduled to spend the night in Wallace and at this time the Purple Heart riders plan on escorting them to Jacksonville. They will spend the night here and we plan on doing something while they are here, this will be announced at a later date when firmed up. Run for the warriors for the 6^{th} year will take place on 19 May. And, for the 6^{th} year we will man a water stop along the route, Also, this year we will be here and not at the annual Convention like we have for the past two years. Mark your calendar and plan on helping out with this as we need members to pass out water to the runners. Our 4th annual Memorial Day Ceremony will take place on 28 May at 1100 at the Veterans Cemetery, we are right on schedule with the planning of the event. After the ceremony, the local scouts will conduct a flag retirement ceremony at the American legion. Bring your tattered, torn flags to the next meeting so they can be retired properly. World War II honor flight carried over from last newsletter

Chapter 642 has partnered with the Carteret Veteran's office and Patriot Casti, Purple Heart national welfare officer in an attempt to put together an honor flight from this area. The purpose of such a flight is to give the WWII veterans a chance to visit their WWII memorial before they die. To Qualify one must have served from 7 Dec 41 to 31 Dec 46 or be a veteran of any war and be terminal. The veteran flies free made available by donations and will have guardians assigned to each and every veteran. The guardian cannot be the spouse of the Veteran due to physical requirement and must be one generation younger and able to handle a veteran if needed. The guardians price is \$250 for the flight. There will be one guardian to one wheelchair vet and one guardian to three

mobile vets. We were aiming at a May flight but that is not possible at this time. If you are interested, please contact me the adjutant at 910 455-1353 and I will get you the proper paperwork.

We show about 8 or 9 WWII vets on our roster but about half of them are out of state. Those of you in the area should have been contacted by now by Patriot Beck, who is also on the committee. Please consider going, this is a one day trip, leaving in the morning and getting home that evening. There will be help for you on the flight and while on the ground in DC, there will also be a doctor, a nurse, chaplain and an EMT on the plane and with you all day. Donations are encouraged and can be sent to: Veteran service office 3710-B John Platt Dr. Morehead City NC 28557 or to me or Grant.

Note: Col O'Toole USMC (Ret) and Patriot Cooney will attend a meeting in Morehead city on 9 May to determine whether to go through with this flight. So far the response has been extremely sparse and we need a definite number of vets before a plane can be locked on.

House panel to approve 1.7 percent 2013 raise

A House subcommittee is prepared to say "yes" to a 1.7 percent military pay raise but "no way" to the Obama administration's plans to significantly hike Tricare fees for military retirees and their families.

The military personnel panel of the House Armed Services Committee also is unwilling to create an independent panel to recommend an overhaul of military retired pay. Their chief objection: the Defense Department's demand that the commission's recommendations be put on a fast track to approval, limiting the ability of Congress to make changes, according to draft legislation unveiled Wednesday.

Headed by Rep. Joe Wilson, R-S.C., the personnel panel is scheduled to meet Thursday morning to pass its portion of the 2013 defense authorization bill, starting a legislative process expected to last until at least Oct. 1, the start of the fiscal year, and possibly longer if election-year politics interfere with details. Patriots – Just an ad on to this article. We are in a fight for our financial future. They want to increase all tri care fees and start charging Tri care for life recipients a fee to be graduated every year. Also the Medicare "B" portion of Social Security is scheduled to more than double in 2014 when Obamacare is scheduled to take affect. It will go from about \$120 a month in 2013 to more than \$240 in 2014. With all the fees that they want to impose we could be paying about \$5000 a year per person for health care after 2014.

I have said this before and I will say it again. If you sit on your rear and do nothing and let the empty suits in Washington screw with our benefits then you are saying; Here are my pockets, stick your hand in and take as much of my money as you want.

I have notified my representatives already more than once and will continue to do so in the future. I personally like my money and want to spend it on stuff that me and my family want, not spread the wealth to those who want to do nothing but be a burden on the government. Get on the band wagon be PROACTIVE not INACTIVE.

Which brings me up to the subject that is close to my heart. We in the MOPH are a support group, a group of individuals that anyone can talk to when feeling down. Our membership in this chapter alone ranges over 70 years in age. Many of us have felt like this and I just want to say that if anyone feels depressed, call one of our older members. The same thing goes for the

wives, the wives see the changes that their husbands have gone through, and so I feel like they should be able to fall back on their more experienced sisters who belong to the LAMOPH, to rely on. We can't forget the children who are the helpless victims of the rage many of us with PTSD feel at times, especially when things don't go as planned. It tears me up when I hear about one of our young Marines or sailors committing suicide how they must have felt so hopeless is depressing. We here in Jacksonville, have more responsibility to take care of the younger troops and their families, because we have so many. Except for the chapter in Fort Bragg, the rest of the chapters have older members on the average, and they don't see this problem

Which brings me up to the final subject that I want to talk about. On the 17th of May two bicyclists will be coming into Jacksonville. They started out in February from Bakersfield, California and are planning on pedaling over 4,200 miles to the wall in Washington. Our Purple Heart Riders are to me them in Wallace and escort them here, where they will be spending the day. They are doing this trip to bring to mind the fact that Veterans can work and to help with the physical and mental health issues that confront our modern troops.. We have our May meeting before they arrive, so we have some time to figure out how to welcome these two, and give them a Jacksonville and Marine Corps welcome.

FInally, I just want to say thank you for allowing me to be the Commander of the best Chapter in the Country for another year, let's see if we can break the 600 member mark.

The Purple Heart riders were formed about two years ago by a Chapter in New Hampshire. The organization was formed by Motor Cycle enthusiasts that wanted to have a riding group within the Purple Heart. They first went to the MOPH and requested to use the circular logo owned by the Order and were told that they could not use it and furthermore if it was worn as a group it would signify Purple Heart sponsorship and therefore liability, which they would not accept.

With that knowledge obtained from National, the New Hampshire chapter set out to establish a Purple Heart riding group with our own constitution and bylaws and in no way part of the Purple Heart Order other than the members must have a Purple Heart. There are Purple Heart Riders now in 38 states and the patch worn on the back of a black denim or leather vest is awesome and in my estimation far better looking that the Purple Heart logo.

Patriot John Cooney, Chapter 642 is the NC President for the association and 12 members to date from Jacksonville and one from Charlotte have signed on already in NC.

The inititial cost is \$80, which includes the patch and a \$10 annual dues. After getting the patch the dues are \$10 per year to primarily maintain the website. The website is:


Al Grow in New Hampshire is the President and JC Allen is the vice Pres out of Texas, both former Marines.
